- iv. Acknowledges that ATC land holdings, and the recent vote to retain Rosehill Racecourse, provides opportunities for the provision of open space for the community in an expanded Camellia-Rosehill Place Strategy, and;
- v. Provides for the construction of a new Metro station in Rosehill to future proof this Precinct.

#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR CITY PLANNING AND DESIGN RESPONSE:**

- 1. The status of the actions for the Tree Canopy Interim Action Plan is as follows:
  - Council has procured Forestree, a tree inventory and management system. The database is being populated by Council's internal resources upon receipt of tree requests/completion of plantings and the database is being reactively updated.
  - After further review, DCP amendments and studies on community perceptions should be considered as part of the finalization of the draft Canopy Plan which will be reported to Council next quarter.
  - Whilst all other actions have commenced, their completion is being delayed due to the large increase (27%) in the number of tree management service requests which receive priority over the proactive management of trees by Council's internal resources.
- 2. In terms of resourcing for the Action Plan:
  - the Forestree inventory management system was developed externally and procured by Council at a cost of \$21,000.
  - No additional funding has been allocated to collect data on Council owned trees (excluding bushland) above the reactive population of the database by internal resources. It is estimated that it could require funds in excess of \$2.5 million to proactively populate the database. This has not been budgeted in the draft 2025/26 budget.
  - Council has allocated \$400,000 for tree planting and \$1.8 million to public tree maintenance which includes the staff resources who are working on delivering the action plan.
  - These budgets do not include the planting of trees associated with capital projects.

#### **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR CITY PLANNING AND DESIGN RESPONSE:**

The proposed residential vehicular parking rates in the draft Site-Specific DCP (SSDCP) are the same as those that currently apply to the site under section 8.2.2 Parramatta North Urban Transformation Precinct within Parramatta DCP 2023.

These rates are also the same as those within the general parking section of Parramatta DCP 2023 (Part 6) with the only difference being that the rates in the SSDCP are maximums rather than minimums.

The bicycle parking rates in the draft SSDCP are the same as those that currently apply to the site under section 8.2.2 Parramatta North Urban Transformation Precinct within Parramatta DCP 2023. The reference to maximum rates is an error and will be updated to state 'minimum'. The proposed non-residential parking rates in the draft

SSDCP are the same as those that currently apply to the site detailed in Part 6 of Parramatta DCP 2023 (section 8.2.2 Parramatta North Urban Transformation Precinct does not contain parking rates for non-residential uses).

To provide the information requested, it is necessary for data to be combined from multiple systems and sources – HR, recruitment, payroll, WHS, organisational development.

There was also additional time involved in the preparation of reports as the request was for data to be provided at a Directorate and Business Unit level.
